# Letter from the President and CEO

In 2023, The Osborn campus was buzzing with an array of activities. We also moved in many new residents – in fact, more new residents moved to Sterling Park last year than ever before.

We also welcomed many new visitors from the community onto our campus to enjoy a number of events, including our WellSpring Programs, Summer Concert Series, and annual Jack Miller Easter Egg Hunt. Our dedicated staff continued to shine, making The Osborn a place that our residents are proud to call home. As I look back on the year, I am proud of all that we have accomplished and where we are heading.

Over the year, we provided a variety of programming that our residents and the community enjoyed. Our WellSpring Series was particularly well attended, especially our author series, including Fiona Davis and Christina Baker Kline. We were delighted by a performance from the Purchase Dance Company, as well as other unique programs. Our residents participated in seasonal events including our Dog Days of Summer, Monte Carlo Night, and Mardi Gras celebrations. Our residents also took part in outdoor activities, such as the Spring Fashion Show, Summer Barbecues, and the John Sterling Putting Tournament.

We continued to partner with the Rye community in many ways. We held intergenerational programs with The Osborn School, including Flag Day, a Halloween Parade, and a yearend holiday concert. We joined together with The Rye Seniors, Rye YMCA, The Rye Nature Center, and SPYRE, and enjoyed several recreational walks on our beautiful arboretum campus.

This past year was a strong one for The Osborn Foundation which received a significant level of charitable support. We received a transformative gift from an anonymous donor to strengthen our Charity Care program. Residents increased their support of our Employee Enrichment Fund and Academic Achievement Awards. Our Foundation continued to support the greater community, and provided support to 25 nonprofit organizations in the Rye community and beyond.

In 2023, we served many people through our different levels of care, including 517 through Osborn Home Care, 680 in The Pasciuti Pavilion skilled nursing facility, and 239 for outpatient therapy.

More than 100 years ago, Miriam Osborn gave a legacy gift to establish The Osborn, a place where her aging friends and neighbors could live comfortably — even if they outlived their resources. Over a century later, our mission still focuses on caring for those in our community.

With today's seniors living longer than ever before, more of them are turning to The Osborn for financial assistance through our Charity Care program. Those receiving support from The Osborn remain confidential and are treated with the same respect and given the same excellent care as all our residents.

The Board of Trustees continues this practice by allocating a portion of our investment income for Charity Care. The Osborn Foundation, through its fundraising efforts, also supports our Charity Care program. This year we were fortunate to receive an anonymous leadership gift to strengthen the program. # The Miriam Osborn Memorial Arboretum

Under the direction of John Sterling, The Osborn's co-founder, the Osborn campus opened in 1908 with gorgeous trees, sprawling lawns, and pedestrian walks. Initially, 2,258 trees were planted. As a result of the special care given, a number of these original plantings remain today for residents, staff, and visitors to enjoy.

Currently on our 56-acre campus, we have 1001 trees representing 124 species. Spending time in nature is an important part of any wellness program, and our residents, staff, and visitors benefit from our beautiful surroundings every day. The trees of The Osborn are a unique treasure that enriches the lives of all of us at The Osborn.

In February 2020, The Osborn was awarded a Level 1 Accreditation by The ArbNet Arboretum Accreditation Program for achieving standards of professional practices. The Miriam Osborn Memorial Arboretum is the only private arboretum in Westchester County.

In 2023, your generous support enabled The Osborn to continue its care of the arboretum, including: (1) pruning, disease control, fertilization, (2) planting new trees to achieve balance and diversity of species, and (3) maintaining trees that may pose a risk to residents and property. We also continued to label trees, update share maps, and offer educational tours. In 2023, we were able to plant 26 new trees with 13 new species. The long-term health of our arboretum depends on your ongoing support of The Osborn's trees — today and well into the future. Please consider making a donation and being part of this legacy.


